This year we are proud to deliver our new campaign "Weather doesn't plan but you can" urging Queenslanders to make an emergency plan today. Once again, we are proud to have rugby league legend Johnathan Thurston (JT) as the program ambassador for Get Ready Queensland, and the face of our campaign.

No matter your personal situation, planning for extreme weather events is essential. Research shows people who are prepared for severe weather recover faster than those who rely solely on outside help.

In the campaign's television commercial, JT walks us through real-life scenarios, demonstrating how severe weather can disrupt not only our own lives but also those we care for. It's a powerful reminder that even if you're not directly impacted, the broader effects—such as power outages, road closures, and interruptions to services—can still create significant challenges.

The multi-channel campaign, spanning TV, radio, digital, social media, and out-of-home platforms, launches at the beginning of Get Ready Queensland Week and will run from 8th October to 16th November 2024. The call to action is simple but urgent: make your emergency plan today. The campaign promotes our new online household emergency plan, a user-friendly tool that generates a personalised plan with local disaster information and essential contacts.

With recent statewide data showing that only 19% of Queenslanders have a written emergency plan, this campaign delivers a clear message.

Additionally, online versions of our new Pet and Livestock Emergency Plans are also available to ensure that everyone, including animals, is prepared.

Together, let's ensure Queenslanders are ready for severe weather.

Key Messages

- Queensland is impacted by more natural disasters than anywhere else in Australia.
- Since 2011, our state has experienced 120 natural disasters, and the 2023-24 disaster season brought with it a record 13 disaster events.
- Households need to be ready for anything, from bushfires and heatwaves to flooding, storms, cyclones, even tsunamis.
- Severe weather impacts the lives of all Queenslanders, affecting how we live, work, move and connect.
- When extreme weather strikes, plan to stay safe.
- Research shows people who are prepared for severe weather recover faster than those who rely solely on outside help.

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- Regardless of your personal situation young or old, new to an area or a long-time resident, homeowner, or renter planning for extreme weather is important.
- Remember, severe weather can limit your access to the everyday essentials you take for granted, like water, power, food, fuel and medical services, and cut access to schools, work, family and friends.
- A current plan that accounts for all aspects of your life will help protect you and your family when disaster strikes.
- Now is the time to Get Ready. Don't wait until tomorrow.
- Regardless of how long you have been a resident, whether you own your home or rent, preparing for severe weather is critical.
- Making a plan online makes it easy to share with your loved ones so they all understand the important part they play.
